Forget trying to learn something from YouTube – the annual Creative Women Workshop at the historic Crook Farm will teach you a variety of skills and crafts using real teachers with actual knowledge, experience and patience. They love what they do and are happy to pass that skill on.

Reservations are now open. Cost is \$45.00. Lunch and all supplies are provided. Just bring your enthusiasm to learn a new skill or craft, meet new friends, and have a ton of fun.

Please mark four choices, numbering them 1 through 4, of classes you would like to take, starting with your first preference. Also please mark one more class, as a backup, in case one of your first four picks is already full.

This year, the Bradford Landmark Society is excited about this year's lineup of classes.

1. ____ **Little Pamphlet Book.** Learn to make a handy dandy little folded book, using marbled paper and a simple stitched binding. A delightful little book that is useful and fun! Teacher is Sarah Boser.
2. ____ **Button Flower Shaker!** Join us as we handcraft flowers using buttons and wire, and arrange them inside a salt/pepper shaker. This summer bloom will last forever! Teachers are Mary Boser and Lisa Miller.
3. ____ **Putz or Glitter Houses.** Not just for Christmas, little cardboard houses are called 'Putz' houses and are part of many Christmas scenes. From an old German tradition, you'll be folding your own Putz house – who knows? You may want to make an entire village! Teacher is Sally Costik.
4. ____ **Learning how to blacksmith** is a popular class, and Bruce Osgood, our expert blacksmith, is ready once again teach you how to forge a towel hook (about 5" to 5 1/2" tall 3 to 4" wide). Class size is limited to four women per session, and always fills up fast, so if you want to learn how to pound hot iron in a real forge, get your reservation in early!
5. ____ **Simply Stretching!** Based on a popular PBS program, this class features a gentle, full-body workout that combines dynamic strengthening and stretching exercises suitable for everyone. Improve your strength, flexibility, posture and mobility! Andrea Wurster is the teacher.
6. ____ **Painting flowers in watercolor.** Learn how to paint charming little paintings of garden flowers in watercolor. It's easy and fun! Teacher is Lynne Hobbs
7. ____ **Zen Meditation Sand Garden.** Zen Gardens recreate the essence of the natural world in a small space. Bob Harris, master gardener, will help you create that essence as you design and build your own personal, miniature garden.

8. _____. **Cylinder Paper Lanterns** for Candles or Lights. Cut out paper designs make each one unique and special! And each can stand on their own or be supported by a regular water bottle for stability. Another upcycled project! Teacher is Mary Gibbs.
9. _____. **Jezykl, a 'porcupine ball'** or the Polish Star, is a traditional handmade harvest/holiday decoration that dates back over a hundred years in Polish folk art. Taught by Tammy Dittman, you will be amazed at how you can make this.
10. _____. **Become a Zentangle artist!** A Zentangle drawing is an abstract, patterned drawing that is a form of artistic meditation that anyone can do. It is very different from regular drawing, painting and other art forms, but easy to learn. Teacher is Sally Costik.
11. _____. **Crochet or Cross Stitch** is becoming a popular skill and is easy to learn! Mother/daughter team Judy and Dina Gates are long time crafters who are eager to teach you the basic skills needed and promise that no previous experience is needed!
12. _____. **Punched Tin Can Lanterns** are an upcycled craft using that is fun and useful! Using a votive candle or tea light, you'll light up your world! Teacher is Mary Gibbs.
13. _____. **Delicate Dried Flowers Pressed Inside a Glass Candle.** Charming, useful, and fun to make. Becca Hilzinger is the teacher.

Total Cost is \$45 for all four classes. All classes will be held at the Crook Farm, 476 Seward Avenue, Bradford. Pre-registration is necessary. Please note: there is a new rule this year to help with scheduling – if three or more women want to be in the same class, we cannot absolutely guarantee (but we'll make every effort) to have all three scheduled in the same class at the same time.
