1Mandala Stones are the latest trend in the craft world to go viral. The colorfully dotted patterns are a real eye catcher and easy to recreate. Learn how simple and satisfying it is to create these beautiful painted stones! Gerri Lyter will teach this fun craft!
2. Transferring photos to wood. Learn how to transfer your own favorite photos and clip art to a wood surface and create a unique and personal gift.
3Bunco. Patti Neidich will lead the way as she explains the rules of this incredibly popular and easy to learn dice game (last year, 27 million women played it!). It's not bunk! It's fun!
4Pysanky (Ukrainian Easter Eggs) make beautiful keepsakes or gifts. For generations Ukrainians have decorated eggshells using hot candle wax, a stylus and colorful dyes to create patterns. In this 2 hour course, you will learn the history of Pysanky making and you will be guided step by step through the process of writing your own pysanka. All materials will be provided. Note: this is a two hour class, so participants may only pick two other classes.
5. Hypertufa Planters - Under the direction of Bob Harris, one of our favorite teachers, and fellow master gardeners, women will learn how to create rustic and unique planters using a mixture of Portland cement, perlite, and water.
6Create your own Votive Candles. Women will forage in nearby field and tree line of the Crook Farm to gather natural items to create unique, decorative votive candles. Judy Yorks will be the teacher.
7Crochet. Gerry Bailey, an experienced crocheter, will help women learn the basics of the art of crochet, a word that means "small hook" in French. Crochet is very versatile and can make a variety of useful projects.
8Learn to Polka! Great exercise and lots of fun as you learn the basics of Polka dancing. Dance partners will be provided to help you learn the steps of this unforgettable lively dance.

9. Quilling – Let's get rolling – paper rolling that is! Quilling is an art form that involves thin strips of paper that are rolled, shaped, and glued together to create decorative designs. Sally Costik will help you explore this newly revived paper craft!
10Blacksmithing. Always one of our most popular classes, Bruce Osgood returns again this year to teach how to make a decorative iron piece using the Crook Farm forge. Due to safety issues (it's HOT!), class size is restricted to four women per session, and PLEASE no open toed shoes or sandals!
11Self-Defense. Sue Everetts, local self-defense expert, returns this year to demonstrate effective ways of protecting yourself against attackers regardless of age or physical ability! Women who took this class last year couldn't stop talking about it!
12. Bocce Ball. Bocce is a time honored sport that has been played for centuries around the world and is a favorite one in Bradford. A great recreational game for all ages! Learn from experienced Bradford bocce players.
Fun with Fiber. Nancy Dryden will help you try your hand at turning raw fleece into wool yarn for knitting, crochet or weaving projects. Drop spindles will be used in this traditional way to turn fiber into yarn.
